Family responses

Surprised, overwhelmed, tearful, but very, very grateful were the reactions of the families when told that their children would be fitted and supplied with a home chair funded through the generosity of the donors.

Background

For children in Malawi with severe mobility and posture problems and who are still too small for a wheelchair, **home chairs for tots** mean that they are not condemned to life lying on the ground or the floor. With a home chair for tots they can now watch the world from an upright position like everyone else and be fed more safely. The chairs are made locally and to orthopaedic specification, with adjustable strapping through the chair back to allow for each child's particular posture needs. The chairs come with a detachable lap tray that serves many useful purposes.

The Malawi Government does not provide aids such as wheelchairs or these home chairs for tots so the Workshop is totally dependent upon charitable donations.
